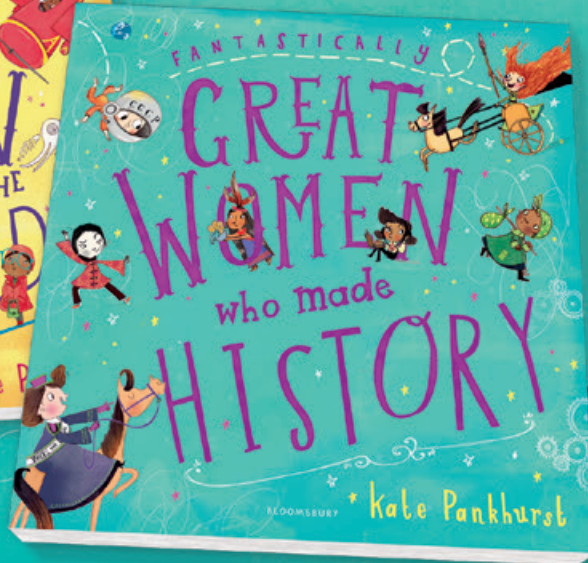
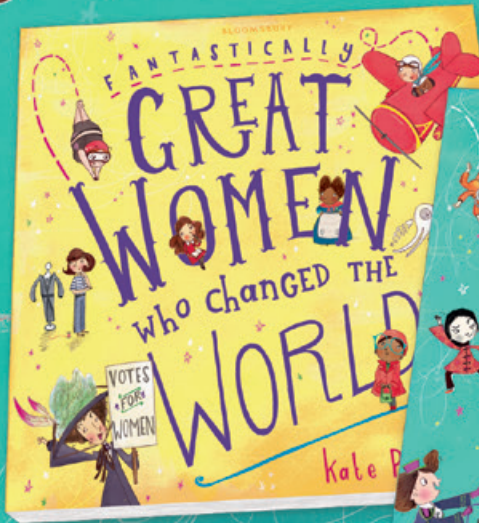

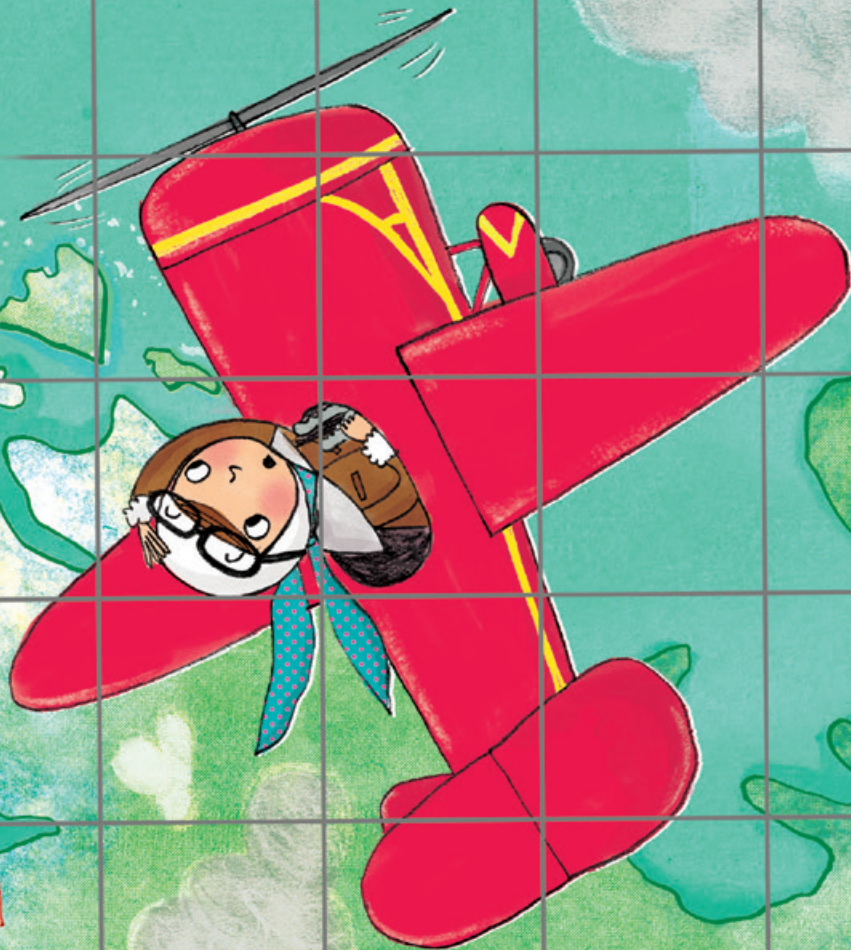
In 1804 Native American teenage girl, Sacagawea, helped a group of 40 male explorers, called the Corps of Discovery, find their way to the west of the USA. And she did the whole thing with a newborn baby on her back! They travelled 6400 kilometres through the Rocky Mountains, down rushing river rapids and through raging storms.

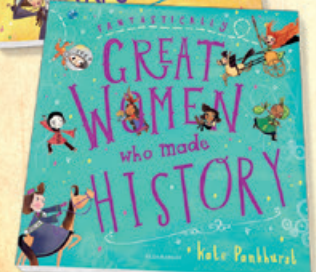

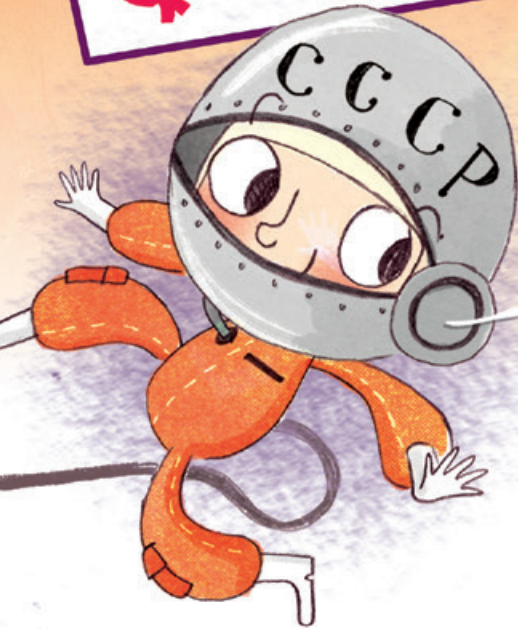
