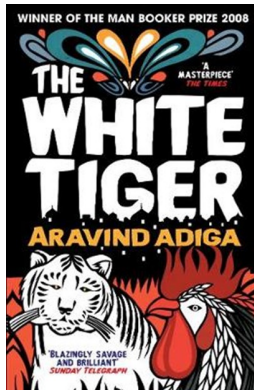

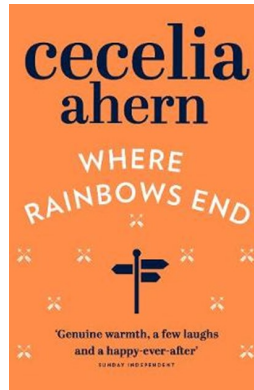
Lasting Letters

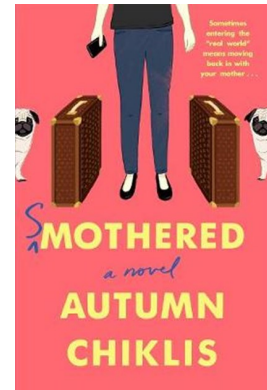
[The White Tiger](#)

Balam gets his break when he is hired as a chauffeur and taken to Delhi. He realises that there is only one way he can become part of this glamorous new India – by murdering his master.



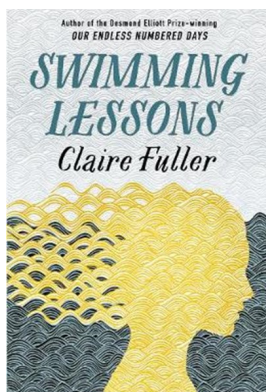
[Where Rainbows End](#)

by Helene Hanff

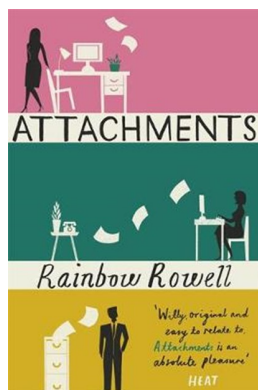
In search of obscure classics, Helene Hanff contacted Marks & Co antiquarian booksellers, developing a long-distance friendship with the staff members that lasted years.

Through a letter to his unborn daughter, Knausgaard describes the world to show the bond between parent and child.

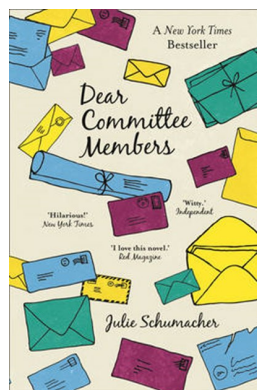
