
All The World's A Stage


Fun Home by Alison Bechdel

Interweaving between childhood memories, college life and present day, Alison looks at her complex relationship with her father and finds they had more in common than she ever knew.




<u>Alexander Hamilton</u> by Ron Chernow

The story of the illegitimate, self-taught orphan from the Caribbean who became the first Treasury Secretary of the United States.




Girl With a Pearl Earring

journey.




The Woman in Black

When Arthur glimpses a young woman, dressed in black, at the funeral of Alice Drablow, a creeping sense of unease takes hold.






<u>The Kite Runner</u> by Khaled Hosseini

Amir is desperate to win his father's approval. The one area where they connect is the annual kite fighting tournament, and Amir is determined to prove to his father that her has the makings of a man.




Wolf Hall by Hilary Mantel


Northern Lights
