




## Climate Change




[Oryx and Crake by Margaret Atwood](#)


[The Drowned World by J.G. Ballard](#)

Set in the future, Ballard imagines a world in which global warming has melted the ice-caps and primordial jungles and swamps have returned to a tropical London.




[There is no Planet B by Mike Berners-Lee](#)

This book is for anyone who yearns for a realistic alternative to the destructive path the world is on at the moment, and wants practical advice on how they can make things better.




[Clade by James Bradley](#)

[Flight Behaviour by Barbara Kingsolver](#)


On the Appalachian Mountains above her home, a young mother discovers a beautiful and terrible marvel of nature.

From one of the world's pre-eminent marine biologists comes a dazzling account of the wonders that lie beneath the ocean's surface, and an empowering vision of how we can protect them.




[\*Black Wave\* by Michelle Tea](#)


[\*No One is Too Small to Make a Difference\* by Greta Thunberg](#)
