




Which books this year have made children giggle?

We loved reading all your recommendations, and have chosen a selection for our list. We hope you enjoy them!


National Reading Group Day is a chance for reading groups to come together and celebrate the community they've created.


RECOMMEND TO A FRIEND




***Zombierella* by Joseph Coelho**

Dread Wood by Jennifer Killick




Only Izzy and her friends can discover the truth, even if they must go SO DEEP UNDERCOVER that they might not come back...




INSPIRE US TO CHANGE THE WORLD
